 May goes to the Palace and tenders resignation

 Johnson goes to Palace and states he can form a Government

 Afternoon
 Johnson cannot go to Palace and say he can form a Government

Thursday 26 July
 Labour **proposes** a No Confidence Vote in the Government

Thursday 26 July
 Labour **does not propose** No Confidence Vote in the Government

Thursday 26 July
 Queen asks May to continue as PM in a caretaker capacity

Thursday 26 July
 Queen asks someone else to form a caretaker administration (Lidington, Benn?)

No Confidence Vote Fails

Consultations to find a way forward, Commons recess postponed

Fortnight foreseen in Fixed Term Parliaments Act to find a majority, otherwise a General Election
14%

Johnson survives, and becomes Prime Minister - is in office until September at least

Way ahead unclear - Johnson does not immediately become Prime Minister, uncertainty drags into summer
