Diagram is organised chronologically

The thickness of the lines is proportional to
the accumulated probability

Probability at each node is indicated with
numbers - 0.1 to 1

Grey boxes indicate options which will
happen anyway, are for info purposes

Probability of each outcome is indicated as
a percentage in the orange boxes at the
end

All options to tighten up Benn Act no longer possible - not enough time due to prorogation

Corbyn tables Vote of No Confidence (VONC) 7 Oct

Corbyn does not table Vote of No Confidence 7 Oct

VONC Succeeds

VONC Fails

House of Commons not prorogued from end of 8 Oct

House of Commons prorogued from end of 8 Oct

Johnson Resigns

Johnson refuses to resign

Johnson essentially dismissed by the Queen

Johnson sits it out, refuses to resign

Negotiations continue in Brussels

Theoretically there might be no solution within the 14 days, but with the Brexit clock ticking that is impossible - an interim PM would be found

Majority for a caretaker Prime Minister within 14 days, probably sooner

No agreement with the EU about a Deal

Deal with the EU agreed

New Prime Minister goes to European Council 17 Oct and asks for Art 50 Extension

Johnson goes to EU summit 17 Oct, has to ask for extension

Johnson goes to EU summit 17 Oct, has a Deal to bring back to London

Vote on the Queen's Speech 18 Oct

Government wins Queen's Speech vote

Government loses Queen's Speech vote

Johnson brings deal back to London 18 Oct, post-Queen's Speech schedule amended

Johnson refuses to resign

Johnson Resigns

Corbyn tables Vote of No Confidence

Caretaker administration formed

Johnson survives, but has to request Article 50 Extension

Johnson refuses to extend and sits things out

Johnson extends and calls a General Election

Caretaker PM goes for General Election first

Caretaker PM goes for People's Vote first

Last Minute Revoke vs. No Deal showdown

Article 50 Revoked by 31 Oct
15%

No Deal on 31 Oct
4%

General Election in late 2019 (needs 3 month Art 50 extension)
43%

General Election in early 2020 (needs 6-9 month Art 50 extension)
15%

2nd Referendum in mid-2020 (needs 9 month Art 50 extension)
21%

Brexit with a Deal (will need a technical Art 50 extension to implement)
2%

Combined chances of GE: 58%
And yes, a GE is not an end point - but I cannot predict a GE just now!

NOTE: this is only the chance of No Deal on 31 October! No Deal after a General Election is still possible but probability not calculable!
